Speed Camera Enforcement Begins August 4th in Muscogee County School Zones

Beginning Monday, August 4, 2025, all school zones in the Muscogee County School District with active speed enforcement cameras will begin issuing citations. Warnings will no longer be given in the 20 active school zones.

This enforcement is part of the School Zone Safety Program, launched last school year by the Columbus Police Department in partnership with RedSpeed and the Muscogee County School District. The goal is to reduce speeding and improve safety for everyone traveling through school zones—drivers, pedestrians, and students alike.

Cameras are active one hour before school begins and until one hour after school dismisses. Drivers should follow the posted school zone speed limit at all times. Any vehicle traveling 11 mph or more over the posted speed limit will receive a citation by mail.

Fines start at \$80 for the first violation and \$130 for each additional violation. These are civil violations and will not add points to your driver's license.
